Orientation for Nursery through 1st grade families. Please go directly to your child's homeroom.

Drop off

School starts for all students promptly at 8:00 a.m. Please arrive on time.

Nursery through Kindergarten families may drop off children for early supervision beginning at 7:30 a.m.

Also beginning at 7:30 a.m., students in 1st through 5th grades may visit the Library or wait with me on the first floor until the bell rings at 7:55 a.m.
